







Allium – Ornamental Onion

Round purple spring to summer blooms on spires up to 12" – 36" tall. Prefer full sun and moist (but not soggy) soil. Perennial. Deer resistant.

Anemone - Windflowers

They various species vary considerably in size, but all have basal leaf clumps from which long flower stems arise to support delicate flowers, 2"-5" in diameter. The flowers are simple single blossoms. Japanese pink and white.





Asters

These upright plants grow 1'- 6' tall and their star-shape flower heads range in color from purple to white to blue. Bloom summer to autumn. Blue, Red,Light purple; Pink; Purple.

Astrantia Masterwort

Astrantia is a group of beautiful and unusual flowers. This shadeloving perennial is not common to most gardens, but it should be. Astrantia grows to be about 1'-2' tall and come in a wide variety of colors. The flowers are unusual and look very much like a star or a firework. Pink and white.

Ajuga

Small, glossy, bronze-maroon and green foliage. This compact groundcover grows to just 2" high, Lilac-blue, 2" tall flower spikes shoot up putting on a brilliant show in Spring. Will tolerate occasional dry soil but prefers regular watering. Suitable for small areas and at the edges of pathways and borders.

Astilbe - Arendsii

Shade loving Perennial. A focal point of your shady summer flower bed, with tall, fluffy plumes that tower above frilly, fern-like foliage. Great companions for other shade tolerant plants, such as hosta and hellebores, with contrasting foliage and coordinating blooms. 6"-5' tall.



















Basket of Gold - Aurinia

An enchanting low-growing, evergreen perennial with masses of shining, golden-yellow flowers that last 4-6 weeks in the spring. Grey-green foliage. Attractive in rock gardens and cascading over the edge of raised beds. Drought tolerant prefers full sun and well-drained soil. 6"-12' tall, 12"-18" wide.

Bee Balm - Monarda

Clusters of frilly petals in mixed shades of red, salmon, and pink. Long stems with minty scented leaves. Full sun or afternoon shade. 30"-36" height. Blooms May through July. Attracts bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds. Deer-resistant. Zones 3-9.





Bergenia - Pigsqueak

Shade perennial. Fills that shady or dappled spot in your garden where so many flowers shy away. Low-maintenance. Partial shade to shade. 6"-12" tall and 1' to 3' spread. Pink, Red, & White flowers.

Black-Eyed Susan - Rubeckia hirta

Native to North America and one of the most popular wildflowers grown. They tend to blanket open fields, often surprising the passerby with their golden-yellow beauty.





Blanket Flower - Gaillardia aristata

A colorful native perennial, with blossoms of orange-red tipped with yellow about 3" across. It must have full sun to prevent it from becoming leggy. Dead head frequently for blossoms all summer. Grows to 2' high, is drought tolerant, deer resistant and valuable for food and cover for birds and pollinators.

Bloodroot - Sanguinaria canadensis

Perennial. A single leaf and white flower with golden center rise on each stem that can reach 12" – 24" high. This member of the poppy family blooms in early spring.











Cardinal Flower - Lobelia

Showy flowers on 8" terminal spikes. Each flower has three spreading lower petals and two upper petals, all united into a tube at the base. Erect leafy stems, often in clusters, with racemes of flowers resembling flaming red spires. The lower portion of the erect stem is lined with lance-shaped leaves. Sun. 24"-48". Blue/Purple.

Chinese Lantern- Monarda

A hardy perennial that provides colorful fall interest. The signature lanterns, which are seed pods, mature to a bright pumpkin-orange in early fall. Chinese lantern is easy to grow as long as it has enough light and well-draining soil. The fruits, both the berries and the seed pods, as well as the leaves, are highly toxic to both humans and animals.





Columbine - Aquilegia

Beautiful purple flowers that bloom spring through summer. Attracts pollinators and is deer resistant. Will self seed. Prefers full sun.







Coneflower - Echinacea

A hardy perennial that will bloom mid-summer to frost. Pollinator friendly. Leave the seed heads on for winter bird forage. Will self seed.





Coral Bells - Heuchera

Small bell-shaped flowers that appear in spring or early summer on the tall stems are rich in nectar and attract hummingbirds and butterflies. Leaves are rounded, lobed, hairy, and evergreen or semi-evergreen, depending on the climate. A great option for woodlands, rock gardens, containers, borders, and ground covers. Part sun to part shade. Perennial. 8"-12". Light green leaves.

Coreopsis

A low-maintenance, drought-tolerant, long-blooming flower to fill a bed or line a border. Grow in upright clumps and feature masses of bright, showy, daisy-like flowers throughout the summer. Sun. 12"-36". Yellow. Photo by Kelly Anderson and Mason Brock











Crocosmia

Full sun to partial shade. 2'-4'. Produces clumps of sword shaped leaves and wands of red, orange and yellow flowers. Lucite, orange and surprise colors.

Cupids Dart - Catanache

Perennial wildflower grown for its tall stems of charming lavender-blue flowers that appear in mid-summer. Attracts pollinators. Excellent for mass planting, and fresh or dried flowers. Deer resistant. Grows to 12"-24" high and 8"-12"

Clinquefoil - Potentilla

A versatile addition to any landscape, potentilla shrubs can be used as hedging, massed along a slope, as a specimen in a mixed border or rock garden, and in containers. It's also a good choice for firescaping and erosion control. The flowers are an important food source for pollenators.

Coral Bells - Heuchera

Small bell-shaped flowers that appear in spring or early summer on the tall stems are rich in nectar and attract hummingbirds and butterflies. Leaves are rounded, lobed, hairy, and evergreen or semi-evergreen, depending on the climate. A great option for woodlands, rock gardens, containers, borders, and ground covers. Part sun to part shade. Perennial. 8"-12". Light green leaves.

Daylilies

Daylilies produce small, deep grape colored blooms that will return year after year with minimal care—even in drought conditions. Sun. 12"-36". Colors include: Brick Red; Europe; Franz Halls Orange; Lemon Yellow; Mauve; Mauve/Peach; Peach; Pink; Yellow; Yellow double flowered; and or course Surprise!











Dianthus Carnation - Dianthus

A charming classic favorite, so effective in masses. Self-sows readily so future plants are assured. A colorful carpet from spring into summer. Straight stems are perfect for bouquets. Sun. 12". Red.

Foxglove

Biennial. Include Foxglove flowers are clusters of tubular shaped blooms. They thrive in full sun to partial shade to full shade, depending on the summer heat. The hotter the summers, the more shade the plant needs. Attracts hummingbirds. Keep away from children and pets. Will re-seed. Sun. 6' tall. Pink.





Germander - Teucrium chamaedrys

A low growing evergreen shrub in the mint family. Full sun, drought resistant, good for erosion control. Can become invasive. Good to Zone 5a.







Ferns



Northern Bracken Fern

Shade perennial. Easily grown in average, consistently moist soils in full sun to part shade. Grows to 3'-4' with a spread from 4'-5'.

Japanese Painted Fern

Shade perennial. A colorful specimen that will brighten the part shade to shady areas of the garden. Silvery fronds with a touch of blue and deep red stems make this fern stand out. About 18" tall and wide.





Ostrich Fern

Partial shade to full shade. A large, 3' tall fern. Named as the plumes are similar to the feathers of ostriches. Cool, moist location in the garden.

Geum

A long blooming member of the rose family. Attracts pollinators. Leaves are deeply lobed with toothed or scalloped edges, forming a dense mound. Use in rock gardens, containers or as a border. Sun. 24"-36". Colors: Eos; Orange; & Prairie Smoke.



Ginger

Large heart-shaped leaves and a dense root system that work together to form a solid ground cover in the shade. An attractive red flower, often hidden from view by the foliage, blooms in early spring. Wild and European available.

Globe Thistle

A fast-growing, contemporary-looking flower. Spherical blue blooms. Drought tolerant, deer and rabbit resistant, and an important source of nectar for pollinators. The spiky foliage serves an important niche in the wildlife garden by providing food as a host plant for painted lady butterflies. In the fall, when the blooming time is over, globe thistles continue to provide textural interest with their attractive seed heads. Sun. 24"- 72". Blue.











Goldenrod

Easy to grow, with magnificent sprays of tiny yellow flowers. This critical food source for pollinators, contrary to popular belief, does not cause hay fever. Sun. 2'-6' tall. Rigid stems which are generally smooth. Yellow flowers.

Grape Hyacinth - Muscari armeniacum

Long, linear, floppy green leaves emerge from the ground in early spring and are followed by purple flowers. The foliage dies back after flowering in the early summer then grows actively again in mid-fall.





Hardy Geranium

A mounding plant, the dark green leaves have a light, citrusy fragrance and a broadly circular shape, with five-petaled flowers. Plant in areas that receive early morning sunlight with afternoon shade, or for areas with open shade from tall trees. Sun to partial shade. 12"-20". Flower colors are a surprise

Helenium - Helenium autumnale

Tall blooms all summer and fall. Flower color is a surprise. Sun. 3-5' at maturity.





Heliopsis

An upright, clump-forming sunflower-like, short-lived perennial. It typically grows to 3-4' tall and features daisy-like flowers (2"-3" diameter) with yellow-orange rays surrounding brownish-yellow center cones. Flowers bloom throughout summer atop stiff stems clad with ovate, toothed leaves Sun. 3'-8'. Yellow.

Hellebore – Bear Claw

Showy plant with deeply divided dark green foliage and early spring bloom. Clusters (cymes) of drooping, bell-shaped, greenish-white 1" flowers with pale green bracts bloom at the tips of leafy stems in early spring. Keep away from children and animals. Partial shade to full shade. 12"-24" Evergreen. Greenish white.











Hollyhock

A must for an old-fashioned cottage garden. Stately spires of large, delicate, wide open, round flowers. Blooms most of the summer. Sun. 3'-8'. Pink.

Hosta

Shade. Mainly grown for their attractive foliage, the plants also produce lovely flowers from early summer to early fall in pink, lavender, light blue, or white. Hummingbirds and other pollinators love the flowers. Random Hosta varieties, great value!.





Hydrangea

Unrivaled in the shrub world for beautiful flowers, these elegant plants are easy to cultivate, tolerate almost any type of soil, and produce abundant blooms. Colors beguile with clear blue, vibrant pink, frosty white, lavender, and rose blossoms—sometimes all blooming on the same plant! Sun to part shade. Annabelle, Oak Leaf, Pee Gee and Unknown.

Hyssop

Perennial herb can be grown in containers or as borders or med to form a low hedge. Full sun, drought tolerant. Pink or purple flowers are showy and bloom mid- to late-summer.

Joe Pye Weed - Eutrochium purpureum

A late blooming perennial that grows in upright clumps up to 7' tall. Full sun to part shade. Prefers moist, well drained soil. Purplish blooms in fall until frost. Great for late season pollinators.

Jupiter's Beard

An ever blooming Old World wildflower with clusters of tiny dark red flowers held over deep green foliage. A tough, durable plant, it thrives with minimal water and care once established. Great Butterfly plant. 24"-36" tall, 30" spread. Full sun, low water.





Lady's Mantle - Alchemilla mollis or vulgaris

Shade, groundcover, Soft gray-green foliage is semi-round with scallopedshaped leaves. In late spring and early summer, the plant produces nearly inconspicuous chartreuse (yellow-green) blooms. Sun to partial shade. Soft gray-green foliage with scalloped leaves. 6"-12". Yellow-Green.

Liatris Gayfeather

Stiff, upright, unbranched stems, 1'-3' tall, grow in wide-spreading clumps. The tufted, purple flowers are densely congested in a long spike on the upper part of the stem. The leaves are narrow and crowded, becoming progressively smaller upward. Liatris species attract butterflies. 1'-3' tall. Full sun. Drought tolerant.





Lily of the Valley

Not a true lily, it is part of the asparagus family. Medium green 5" – 10" long and 1" to 3" inches arch from the center of a clump. Petite, fragrant, white flowers rise on long stems from the leaf clumps in spring. This is a hardy groundcover spreads gradually but persistently to form dense colonies.

Maltese Cross – Lychnis chalcedonica

Perennial with four and five petal cross shaped flowers that grow in clusters of scarlet red blooms. This member of the carnation family is a show-stopper. 3' to 4' tall, moist well drained soil. Good for border or cottage garden.

Giant Meadowrue – Thalictrum rochebrunianum

A big bold clump forming perennial with dainty flowers. 4' - 6' high, 2' - 3' wide. Use in borders and natural areas. Intolerant of intense heat.

Milkweed - Asclepias speciosa

The host plant for Western Monarch butterflies, monarch caterpillars eat the plant! And that's a good thing. The plant grows in full sun in well-draining soil. It blooms star-shaped clusters of fragrant pinkish flowers in summer to early fall. The flower nectar is attractive to many pollinators. The plants grow 2'-3' tall and spread about 2'-3' wide.





Pearly Everlasting - Anaphalis margaritacea

A tall, herbaceous perennial wildflower with stems up to three feet tall. The leaves are long and slender with green surfaces and densely whitewoolly undersides, matching the cottony stems. The flowers often have a slightly musky odor.

Peony

An outrageously beautiful in bloom from spring to summer with lush foliage all summer long. Sun to Partial Shade. 2'-3' tall. Barzella Itoh, Coral Charm, Dr. Alexander Fleming, Edan's Perfume, Gay Paree, Joker, Kansas, Roselette, Sarah Bernhardt, Shirley Temple, Top Brass, Vivid Rose, and more!

Persecaria

Showy pink, red, or white spikelike flower clusters followed by distinctive oval fruits. Full sun to part shade. Divide in spring or fall.





Phlox

Many star-shaped, colorful flowers when in bloom. Sun. 2'-4' tall. Upright, grows in clumps with pointed green elliptical leaves are deep green that are 4"-6" long. Miscellaneous colors.

Primrose

Perennial with diffusely clustered system of unbranched stems. Up to 3' tall with yellow or pink flowers. Full sun, regular water, well drained soils. Pollinator friendly.





Red Hot Poker

Flower spikes are bright red with a long blooming period. Full sun. 2'-4' tall. Likes well-drained soil and a neutral pH.

Rose Champion

Easy to grow and has erect, white-gray flowering stalks with Red flowers. Low maintenance. Sun to partial shade. 1-2' tall spreading to 1-2'. Pink, Red/Purple, Franz Shubert Purple.

Salvia

A mainstays of the midsummer garden border—blooming summer to autumn! Planted in the spring, these aromatic beauties are great for cutting and beloved by bees and butterflies. Heat and drought tolerant. 2'-5'.Blue, Marcos, May Night, Rose Queen, Rose Sensation and more!



Sedum

Clumping. Succulent leaves and small colorful clusters of flowers. Yellow. Sun. 1'-3' tall. Yellow too!

Solomon's Seal – Polygonatum Spp.

Clumping. Glossy dark green leaves. Sun. 2"-3" tall. Clumping. Glossy dark green leaves. Partial to full shade, rich well drained soils. Deer Resistant. White.





Speedwell

Grows in clusters and blooms from spring to autumn. Sun, can tolerate partial shade. 1'-3' tall. Blue & Purple.

Veronica

Purple or white flowers will rebloom if spent flowers are removed. Florets open on spikes from the base upwards for long-blooming color. Attracts pollinators. Easy to grow, low maintenance, deer resistant, great cut flowers. 18"-22' tall, full sun.

Groundcover. Evergreen ground cover. Has shiny, leathery leaves. Five-petal purple flowers. Can be used to carpet wooded or

sloping locations. Sun to partial shade. 8"-12".

Yarrow

Very hardy in all seasons. Tall stems of flowers and fern like foliage. Very drought tolerant once established Full sun. 1"-12" tall. Peach, Pink & Pale Yellow.

Yucca

Striking succulent with long sword-like leaves and impressive flowering stalks. Low maintenance, drought tolerant. Avoid planting to near the house as the invasive roots can damage foundations and pipes.
